



Mon, March 13, 2023

MORNING SESSIONS

Opening Keynote – Deeping Professionalism in the Onsite Treatment Industry

David Gustafson, University of Minnesota

Working with wastewater can always be looked at as last chance opportunity. In typical media representations our Industry is typically part of a comedy routine. But we know that all of that is not the facts. Working hard to become a represented long-term professional solution for wastewater infrastructure is a critical discussion for all of us to have and make real for our customers and stakeholders. This issues and steps that can be applied locally will be the focus of this discussion.

Professional Maintenance for the Onsite Systems: Working in Tanks David Gustafson, University of Minnesota

All systems need care and management. Looking at these processes for systems is critical. Understanding the operation and maintenance of a septic tank and evaluating the sewage coming into the tank will be the focus of this discussion.

What makes Pennsylvania's Soil so Difficult? - Exploring the reasons behind the complexity of soils in the Keystone State

Russ Losco, Lanchester Soil Consultants

Pennsylvania is blessed, or cursed, with an incredible variety of soil and site conditions. When working in one geographical area, it is easy to get used to the soils found there. But sometimes, simply moving from one valley to

another, or from the valley floor to a footslope can bring you in contact with soils of a vastly different nature. Moving from one region to another or one end of the state to another can mean vastly dissimilar soil and the need for differing approaches. In this session we will try to explore the complex origins of the wide variety of soil in Pennsylvania.

State Ethics for Regulatory SEOs Mary Fox, Executive Director, State Ethics Board

Attend this unique session taught by State Ethics Board staff. The Ethics Act states that public office is a public trust. Efforts to realize financial gain through public office or employment other than compensation provided by law is a violation of that trust. In this presentation, learn what the Ethics Act is and how the State Ethics Commission enforces it, review some of the most-frequently violated Ethics Act provisions, and discover how to spot a potential problem so you can stay on the right side of the Ethics Act.

AFTERNOON SESSIONS

Professional Installation Practices for Soil treatment Areas David Gustafson, University of

David Gustafson, University of Minnesota

Installing the system properly is the key for that system to perform long-term. Discussing the principles of good installation is helpful as we are all looking to create the best solution for decentralized wastewater infrastructure.

<u>Preparing Septic Owners in the Age of</u> Floods

Jennifer Fetter & Andy Yencha, Penn State Extension Water Resources Educators SEOs must routinely educate property owners on how they can best dealing with flooding issues and their onsite wastewater systems. Attendees will learn preventative steps to protect a system; steps to take immediately prior to a flood event; what to do during a flood; how to recover a system after the flood; as well as assessing any damage and/or contamination issues. This session will provide you with the tools necessary for you to explain flooding concerns to residents within your jurisdiction.

<u>Sewage Law Potpourri</u> *Martin Seigel, Barley Snyder*

This session will include an update of recent sewage-related legal developments over the past year, including actions by courts and DEP. Other issues, such as the importance of updating fee structures and private ownership of sewage facilities will also be addressed.

Professional System Design and Layout David Gustafson, University of Minnesota

The beginning of a system is the proper design & layout of that system. Having the information for those decisions is a key to the system meeting the expected performance for performance and operation. Evaluating and communicating those key aspects of layout and design is an essential step for maximizing success of system life and performance.

Small Flow Treatment Facilities Adam Browning, Penn's Trail Environmental

This session is intended to identify when and where Small Flow Treatment Facilities can be used and how they are permitted by the PADEP. We will dive into the Act 537 Component 3s Module

requirements, NPDES Permitting requirements and processes as well as the Water Quality Management or construction permitting process associated with the installation of a SFTF or Single Residence Sewage Treatment Plant. We will also explore different treatment options and how they affect the permitting process as well as what to expect from an operational compliance standpoint.

Effluent Filters and Septic Tank Safety Patrick Mulhall, Polylok

This session will cover the basics of effluent filters and the importance of septic tank safety. Participants will learn about filters, the role they play in maintaining a healthy septic system, filter regulations, and the risks of not using filters. We will discuss two separate case studies and the benefits of effluent filters. The second half of the session will focus on septic tank safety and homeowner education. Having a safe septic tank is priceless. We will review the risks of an unsafe tank and discuss the importance of education to achieve the safest environment possible, even when regulations don't require it.

Tue, March 14, 2023

MORNING SESSIONS

Working with Small Communities: Starting with a Plan David Gustafson, University of Minnesota

Small communities and groups of families are constantly facing the problem of what to do to solve the wastewater infrastructure issue. Are decentralized the right choice, should we move to a municipal solution or are there other

choices? This discussion will explore and introduce a plan to help evaluating the choices and creating a community solution that is understandable and sustainable.

<u>Dealing with Septic Systems Post-</u> <u>Disaster</u>

Walter Schneider, Centre Region Code Administrators

In the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, there is a potential for all types of disasters to occur. This program addresses concerns for a septic system post-disaster to include dealing with fires, floods, and earthquakes. Short-term and long-term operational conditions for onsite wastewater systems will be discussed.

<u>Using Technology to Improve the SEO</u> <u>Workflow</u>

Mike Callahan, SoilHub

Technology impacts many aspects of a SEO's job and the on-site industry in general. This session will look at some computer-based tools for managing site evaluations, report generation, and septic system design and layout. We'll discuss options for using these tools in the field and how to integrate with handwritten data sheets. Finally, we'll discuss processes to organize projects and sharing projects across disciplines.

<u>Introduction to Nitrogen Treatment</u> David Gustafson, University of Minnesota

Treating wastewater is one of the priorities for determining system choices. Treating Nitrogen takes a little knowledge and understanding of the treatment processes and their applications is critical for this to happen in the installed technologies and systems.

Introduction to Pressurized UV Lights Oran Biehl, Premier Tech Water and Environmental

The purpose of a UV disinfection unit is to reduce the concentration of fecal coliforms. The operating principle of the UV disinfection unit is to expose microorganisms to a given dose of ultraviolet rays. The dose depends on the time of exposure and the intensity of the rays; the applied flowrate on the UV unit ensures an optimal exposure time providing the required dose. This session will cover where UV lights are required and how to service & design with the DiUV (pressurized UV).

Tank Buoyancy and Anti-Flotation Measures

Cody Vigil, Infiltrator Water Technologies

An important consideration in the installation of septic, pump, or holding tanks is the risk of flotation due to the presence of groundwater above the bottom of the tank. The goal of this presentation is to prompt regulators, designers, and installers to think about buoyancy for the installation of any tank installation. When a rigid object such as an empty septic, pump, or holding tank is partially or fully submerged in groundwater, an upward force is exerted on the object that is equal to the weight of the displaced groundwater. This presentation will develop two very simple models for evaluating buoyant force. Engineering controls, such as ballast systems, concrete pads, and helical anchors and associated best installation practices are evaluated. This presentation will include a discussion of Archimedes' principle, basic geotechnics of buried tanks, uplift forces, buoyancy control function, and buoyancy control best practices.

About PASEO

HISTORY

The PA Association of Sewage Enforcement Officers was established in 1986 by sewage enforcement officers from across the Commonwealth. PASEO's founders felt a need for interaction and cooperation among the many SEOs and between the organization and the PA Department of Environmental Protection (then DER).

Our founders' goals are now the Bylaws-

- ► Encourage and maintain the highest standards of professional ethics and practices;
- ▶ Sponsor and promote educational programs for members and others:
- ▶ Provide a forum for the exchange of info; and,
- ➤ Act on behalf of members in connection with proposals concerning SEOs

FRAMEWORK

PASEO has grown from an idea shared by a handful of SEOs with diverse professional and vocational backgrounds to a vibrant and growing organization. Our membership is organized into six regional chapters with each region corresponding to a PADEP region. This has enabled and fostered a communication link between PADEP and the Association.

Each chapter elects officers, sponsors training programs, and maintains a liaison and dialogue with the PADEP staff in its region. Every chapter selects two Directors.

At the annual meeting, the membership elects the officers who serve for 2-year terms. The Regional Directors and the Officers, who together constitute the Board of Directors (the Board), select and initiate activities and programs on behalf of the members. Association policy goals may be set by the

Board or the membership. From the membership, policy goals may be proposed as resolutions. A resolution embodies a proposal which a chapter has considered, adopted, and forwarded to the state Association. At the annual meeting, the members consider and vote on resolutions from all chapters. Those that are adopted become PASEO policy goals.

PROGRAMS

Through its newsletter, the REPORTER, the Association communicates with the members, the PADEP, and every member of the General Assembly. Members can keep abreast of Association happenings by visiting the PASEO website at pa-seo.org.

Direct conversations in every region bring PADEP and PASEO to closer understanding of the Act 537 program and the other's perspective.

PASEO is an active member of the PADEP Sewage Advisory Committee, having been appointed by the Secretary of Environmental Protection.

PASEO's annual conference is the premier educational opportunity for sewage enforcement officers. Members attend at a discounted rate.
